## **SNAPSHOT**

State requires objective student growth as part of teacher evaluation system.	YES
Teachers must meet student growth goals or be rated at least effective on the student growth portion to be rated overall effective.	NO

## **CHARACTERISTICS**

Weight of student growth:	Tested teachers: 50%  35% value-added assessment model  15% other measures of student growth (i.e., student learning targets)  Nontested teachers: 50%  Progress toward student learning targets as measured by state-approved common assessments
Role of student growth in overall score:	<ul> <li>The state provides mandatory scoring ranges.</li> <li>Student growth and qualitative assessment are each represented by a subscore between 1 (lowest) and 4 (highest). These two scores are averaged for the final composite score.</li> <li>A teacher may be rated effective: proficient (the second highest rating) with an average of 2.5. Therefore, if a teacher earns a 1 for student growth and a 4 for qualitative assessment, he/she could be rated overall effective: proficient.</li> </ul>
