What happens when a student misses school?

When students miss school frequently, it's difficult for them to catch up. As early as kindergarten, excessive absences can cause children to fall behind.

Data shows that missing 10 or more days of school will:

- reduce reading scores by 12 percent
- reduce math scores by 15 percent
- reduce a student's chances of remaining on track to graduation by 34 percent

Did you know?

- One in 10 kindergarten and 1st grade students nationally is chronically absent, missing a month of school.
- By 6th grade, absenteeism is a sign that a student may drop out of high school.
- By 9th grade, high attendance is a better predictor of graduation rates than 8th grade test scores.
- Missing 10% (about 18 days) of school will make it harder for a student to learn to read.
